In Brief

Focus Groups to Develop our art exhibition «Témoigner pour agir » Three focus groups were held this winter with members of COCQ-SIDA, GRIS-Montreal and Stella to help design and implement an art exhibition on public testimonials, Témoigner pour agir. The discussions helped answer a series of questions related to the content and the kinds of testimonials we want to exhibit; the ways to reach diverse audiences; and some of the emerging ethical and material issues raised by this project.

Participants showed interest in continuing to meet for more discussion throughout the implementation of the art exhibition. The next meeting should take place this Summer. The exhibition will take place at the Maison de la culture Frontenac, November 29th 2017 to January 21st 2018

Film Screening: Herma, XXY intersexuation

On March 23rd we organized a screening of the documentary film Herma, XXY intersexuation. The documentary delivers a vibrant testimonial on finding ones gender identity. The discussion that followed, with director Melanie P. Pelletier, the main character of the film Sunny Dagenais and Janik Bastien-Charlebois, sparked beautiful reflections on intersex issues and gender identity.
