Seminar: « Supporting Individuals who Deliver Public Testimonials: What Tools are Needed? »

Marie-Ève Gauvin and Maude Ménard-Dunn will present the results from a mixed-methods study that aimed to evaluate the appreciation of the educational tools developed by Testimonial Cultures since 2009. Seminar: "Body Politics and the Politics of Language: Deafness and Intersexuality in Dialogue"

In February 2017, Véro Leduc and Janik Bastien-Charlebois will address the intersectionality between deafness and intersexuality.

Words aren't merely words; they shape our relationship to the world. What are the politics of language in our testimonial cultures? After a presentation of the common issues faced by both deaf and intersexed individuals (surgeries at birth, standardization of bodies), a dialogue on language as a site of power relations will be introduced. Empowerment will be addressed from a critical perspective on gender and audism.

Call for Proposals: Presentation of One's Sexual Self, Self-objectification and Erotic Capital

Organized by **Chiara Piazzesi** and **Julie Lavigne**, this master class will feature exchanges between professors and students on their doctoral research projects. This master class is directed at students who wish to reflect on the broader orientation of their thesis project or who are looking for a space to discuss methodological and epistemological questions. This class aims to help students finalize their research project or support them in their writing process. The deadline for submitting a proposal is **December 15**, **2016** to Chiara Piazzesi. The master class will take place on **March 17**, **2017** at UQAM.

Art exhibition « Témoigner pour agir »

The preparation of the art exhibition, Témoigner pour Agir, which will take place at the Maison de la Culture Frontenac in Montreal, from **November 29, 2017 to January 21, 2018**, is making good progress. This Fall, the Community Wisdom Committee, consisting of representatives from various sexual and gender communities with experience in delivering public testimonials, met several times. The Committee evaluated the 24 artists' submissions we received, as well as two community art projects. Artworks were selected: they explore the use of public testimonials, sexuality, activism and the media, AND they express a desire to undo prejudices, sharing of unrecognized realities as a means to advocate for human rights.

COCQ-SIDA

The second Quebec meeting on HIV/AIDS community-based research was held on September 29 and 30, 2016. The meeting was organized by a committee of representatives from: COCQ-SIDA, MIELS-Québec, PVSQ, MAINS BsI, Stella, Maison Plein Coeur, ASTTeQ, REZO, UQAM, UQAT, REACH 2.0 and Coalition PLUS. The event was made possible through funding from the Canadian Institutes of Health Research. Seventy representatives from community, institutional and academic sectors gathered to discuss current research priorities and the initiatives to address them. Ongoing community-based research projects were the subject of a special session of presentations where Maria Nengeh Mensah, Marie-Ève Gauvin and Maude Ménard-Dunn talked about Testimonial Cultures' projects.

« Autopornography » seminar

As part of the new academic year 2016-2017, Testimonial Cultures organized a seminar on September 9th at UQAM This seminar was filled with rich discussions, and opened the door to a new phenomenon : autopornography. Three researchers presented the ways in which they understand and work with autopornography. Watch them on video on our website!

Book project, an editited collection is on the way.

Drawing on the proceedings from our ACFAS conference last May, a book project will be submitted for evaluation by Presses de l'Université du Québec (PUQ). This editied collection of articles mobilizes scientific and field knowledge, as well as excerpts from interviews conducted with members of sexual and gender communities who have given public testimonials in Quebec. The authors, from a variety of backgrounds, will lay out the theoretical and methodological groundwork on the uses of personal and intimate stories as an important lever for social change. The collection is edited by Maria Nengeh Mensah in collaboration with plastics/visual artist AJ Dirtystein, our postdoctoral fellow.
