

Follow-up from the Executive Committee meeting held Dec 12 2011

The research professors met with the coordination team and to share their visions of the project and to consider various issues. The specific characteristics of the partnership were highlighted: multisectorality (universities, community groups, associations) with contributions from many disciplines (women's studies, social work, film, criminology, communications, sociology, history, architecture, literary studies, sexology, ...). We will need to develop a work schedule that is both realistic and taking into account the main interests of each working group. Activities will be developed based on a range of ideas that were proposed at the General Assembly meeting:

- Workshop on research ethics
- DVD compilation of testimonial by people living with HIV and by sex workers
- Study Day on the conditions within which testimonials are produced (Fall 2012) bringing together the training expertise of the various partners (LGB testimonials by GRIS-Montreal; popular education by sex worker groups (Sensibilisation XXX); ethical and supportive accompaniment by COCQ-SIDA and the VIHsibilité project)
- Dissemination of research results from the VIHsibilité project
- Development of a virtual workspace offering a dynamic way to share project archives & resources.
